



Japanese Fish Windsock

You will need ...

- White fabric (such as an old sheet)
- A pair of scissors or a craft knife
- Fabric glue
- Felt-tipped pens
- Piece of stiff wire (like copper)
- Two pieces of fishing nylon
- Long rod or stick

Put it together...

- Cut out both templates (if you can enlarge them first all the better)
- Place the templates on to a sheet of white fabric and draw around them
- Cut out the two pieces of fabric and colour in using bright colours
- On the reverse side of each, glue along the long edge. Don't apply glue to the tail and mouth ends as these remain open
- Sandwich the two pieces together
- Make a circular piece of wire that is the length of both pieces marked mouth flap. Fold both flaps so that the wire ring sits underneath each tab
- Glue both tabs down to secure the ring
- Attach a piece of fishing nylon to each side of the mouth by tying the ends to the wireframe
- Attach the other ends of the fishing nylon to a long rod or stick. The air on a windy day, at least should now funnel through your windsock so that it moves around in the breeze


