





Place mats

You will need ...

- Equipment Card, glue, glue spreader
- Lengths of different coloured strings (you could dye plain string with food colouring) or use coloured wool.

What you do ...

- Cut out a circle from the card the size of the circle will depend on the size of the mat required.
- Cover one side of the circle with glue.
- Taking some coloured string or wool, then start in the centre of the circle and work outwards to create a spiral of string or wool.
- Keep changing colours until you have come to the edge of the cardboard circle.



Napkin rings

You will need ...

- Toilet roll tubes.
- Coloured wool.
- Card and paint.
- Scissors
- Glue.

What to do ...

- Two cardboard toilet roll cubes will make six napkin rings.
- Cut each tube in to three, 35 millimetre (1¼ inch) long rings.
- Wrap wool neatly around one of the rings until the cardboard is completely covered.
- Stick the end of the wool down inside the ring with a small amount of glue.
- If you want to you could make some decoration to go on the ring, or find something to decorate it with, then stick it on to the ring. If it is near to Christmas you could use holly leaves.
- Make more rings in the same way.
